## **Natalie Drummond Ice Dye Supply List**

- Fiber Options
  - Pre-Wound Tencel or Cotton Warps
  - 4.5 Yards (5/2 or 8/2 weight) 3 warps 50-80 ends each.
  - Cotton Fabric
  - Three one-yard pieces of fabric maximum; one yard for each bucket.
- All fiber needs to be scoured ahead of the workshop. The instructor will provide instructions via a pre-workshop video.
- Ten Cotton Fabric Test Squares (5" x 5")
- Dritz Cheesecloth (optional)
- 3 shallow tubs with lids (28 quart) for muck dyeing
- 7 lb bag of ice per tub
- Spice Shaker/Plastic spoons/brushes to mix and apply dyes.
- Variety of Resists: plastic/wood clothes pins, binder clips, sewing thread, wood, or acrylic shape resists - you can also scrunch your fabric!
- Soda Ash (I use Jacquard) \*
- Synthrapol \*
- Fiber Reactive Dyes\*

If using on-hand dyes, the dyes should be relatively new or within the shelf-life of the dye. The shelf life of powdered fiber reactive dye, for example, varies from 1 to 5 years depending on the color, after that, it will gradually start to lose its strength. Storage conditions are important. Shelf-life is severely shortened by extreme heat, light, and moisture. Natalie will have dyes available for a fee if you do not have recent dyes. (See **Dye Intensity Table**.)

\* These three items will be available to purchase from the instructor. The instructor will bring a selection of custom dye colors that are reported to have a lot of splits. Participants will need to bring containers to take home a small amount of synthrapol. A material fee of \$15 - \$25 should be expected.

## Safety is a must!

- N95 Mask or Respirator Mask with particulate filters.
- Gloves waterproof gloves that go above the wrist. Avoid gloves that have sewn seams.
  Please see dye and Synthrapol labels for more safety details.

## **Preparation Notes and Helpful Links**

- Fiber-Reactive Dye Sources: You will need at least 4 dye colors to build a palette if just starting out. Palette is defined as a selection of colors that an artist might use. I have used all these dye sources with successful results! If you want to mix your own then use Pro-Chem, Dharma, Happy Cat Tie Dye, or DyeSpin. If you like a lot of color, you will want to use at least one dye that is reported to have a lot of color splits. Waxon Studio also has fiber reactive dyes pre-mixed with Soda Ash.
- 5/2 Tencel Sources 50-80 ends for each warp! Smaller batches work better in workshop experiences. Each warp should have a loose cross and choke ties on each end. - Spice jar shakers or sifters are recommended for mixing and applying dyes evenly with control.

- Plastic Teaspoons
- **Tubs:** The size of the tub is roughly 24" x 16" (28 quart) by Bella Storage Solutions. You will want to consider lids so you can stack them and let them sit undisturbed in a temperature-controlled space for a minimum of 24 hours. The Dollar Tree or a local hardware store is a good place to get tubs, or Amazon. Some have used a basement, bathtub, or a cooler when climate/temperatures are not conducive to slow melts.
- Ice Cubes: Bigger ice cubes work differently than crushed ice or snow. 7 pounds/container.
